About the ECSYO & SE

The Eastern Connecticut Symphony Youth Orchestra (ECSYO) and String Ensemble (SE) are education programs of the Eastern Connecticut Symphony Orchestra that provide young musicians from around the region the opportunity to perform challenging, high quality compositions in a variety of styles. First conceived and developed by Harriet Friedstein and Victor Norman in 1966, this program encourages young musicians to learn not just the notes of the score, but also about the composers, history, and meaning behind the music.

The two ensembles – ECSYO and SE – offer a unique musical experience to young musicians in grades 4 to 12 of different skill levels.

Our Youth Orchestra brings musicians from local school orchestra and band programs together into a traditional orchestra format. Typically students are in grades 8-12, and have played their instrument for 3-5 years.

We also offer a Strings Ensemble group for grades 4-8 for students who are looking to enhance their string learning beyond the classroom!
